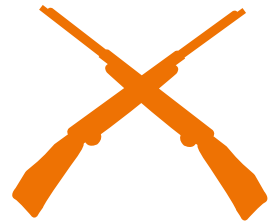

Why ending hunger matters



140 million

Conflict remains the main driver of food insecurity in 2024, with 139.8 million people facing acute food insecurity in 20 countries or territories.



673 million

people in the world are undernourished.

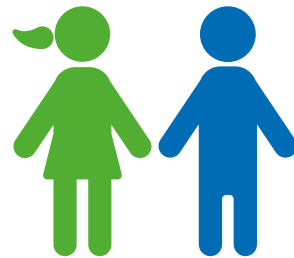
The African continent is now home to nearly half of the world's hungry people, and this figure is projected to rise to 60% by 2030.

In 2024, a total of 295.3 million people experienced high levels of acute food insecurity requiring urgent food and livelihood assistance.

150 million



Although stunting is declining slightly, it still affects 23.2 per cent (150.2 million) of children under the age of five years old.

Acute food insecurity is likely to worsen across 13 'hotspots': Sudan; occupied Palestinian territories; South Sudan; Haiti; Mali; Yemen; the Democratic Republic of Congo; Myanmar; Nigeria; Burkina Faso; Chad; Somalia; and the Syrian Arab Republic.

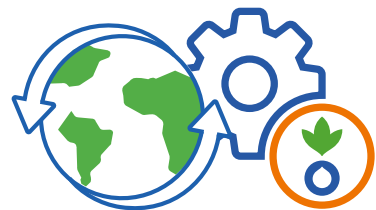


Women and children are disproportionately affected by undernourishment: only 48 per cent of women and 25 per cent of children in Africa achieve minimum dietary diversity.

Where we work

Divya's story

“They showed me how to hold her properly ... now I understand what she needs.”



Divya was just three days old when Action Against Hunger health workers visited her at home.

She had just returned from hospital with her mother, Rupangi. When the team arrived, they found Rupangi bathing her newborn daughter in the cold weather. Newborn babies can lose body heat quickly - Divya was shivering and at risk of hypothermia.

“We just wanted to clean her after coming home,” Rupangi explained.

Divya's father, Atit, also shared that they had been giving their daughter packaged milk because she was struggling to breastfeed.

So, the team used the visit to give Rupangi and Atit practical guidance about caring for their new baby.

Health workers explained why warmth is essential for healthy growth and introduced Kangaroo Mother Care, a simple technique where a baby is held skin-to-skin against a parent's chest to regulate temperature and support development. They demonstrated how to position Divya safely and how Kangaroo Family Care could continue at home.

The team also showed Rupangi and Atit how to feed Divya. They demonstrated correct positioning and latching techniques and explained the importance of exclusive breastfeeding

in the first six months, when breastmilk provides all the nutrients a baby needs and helps prevent malnutrition.

“They showed me how to hold her properly,” Rupangi said. “Now I understand what she needs.”

Over the following months, Action Against Hunger teams and Community Health Workers continued home visits to monitor Divya's growth and provide further support with breastfeeding. At six months, they helped the family to introduce age-appropriate complementary foods to support her nutritional needs.

By eight months old, Divya weighed a healthy 7kg. She was gaining weight steadily and showing signs of healthy development.

With continued follow-up and the family's commitment to applying what they learned, Divya is now on a path to a healthy childhood.
